



The Matrimandir is situated in the centre of the international community of Auroville in South India. The plan for building the city is based on the shape of a Galaxy (right page). In a span of 50 years (starting 1968), Aurovilians built a healthy, green environment on what was once completely barren land. Toward the end of 2021, Auroville has felt a divide with two different positions regarding the development of the city. This split within our community made me quite sad.

One of the main purposes of Auroville is to be an experiment for human unity on earth. With people from 50 different nations, and rich, diverse backgrounds, we continue to learn and grow in this ideal.

During a meditation in the Matrimandir inner chamber, I had a vision of the Galaxy on the bark of the large Elephant Ear tree (at the crossing next to Matrimandir's entrance).

To manifest the Galaxy with my artwork from the bark of a tree is my contribution to unity within Auroville.

The Matrimandir is the largest golden building in the world.


One of the first settlements in Auroville in the 60s, surrounded by barren, eroded land.


50 years later the lush and beautiful green environment today.





Galaxy plan by archtect












3 more digitally modified versions (only colour) of the "Blue Galaxy".





"Blue Galaxy", 2022 97 x 97 cm, oil colour on Chinese paper, back ground painted with acrylic colours.





A little bit on the technique of how I print from nature...


The process of printing starts with cleaning the tree surface thoroughly. I then apply a thin layer of oil colour with a roller on the bark. Following this, I place the paper or fabric and using soft pressure capture the impressions. My work is created without the use of any chemicals and solvents and the technique I use does not harm the trees. The colour that stays visible on the bark enhances the texture, making the tree look like a beautiful sculpture.








The unprinted Galaxy on the bark of the Elephant ear tree (Enterolobium cyclocarpum)






"Art Camp Galaxy", 2022, 120 x 120 cm

Bark print with oil colour on Japanese paper, pasted on canvas and painted with mixed media. This work was finished on canvas during the Auroville Art Camp in March 2022.










"Deep Space Galaxy", 2022, 69 x 69 cm, bark print with oil colour on Chinese paper, then painted with acrylic colours.


Evolving of the "Deep Space Galaxy", which got printed in 4 different colours off the bark. Each of the 4 colours represents one zone of the town planning.






"Turquoise Galaxy", 2022










"Colourful Galaxy", 2022 90 x 90 cm, Bark print with oil colour on Japanese paper, then painted with mixed media.




"Fractal" Ganeshas

Not only beautiful Galaxies manifested while I was working on this Enterolobium tree, but also some quite incredible Ganeshas. To manifest the Galaxy from a tree bark is a beautiful paradox, bringing the two opposing positions in Auroville together. And to find Ganesha - the remover of obstacles - on the same place is quite a sign!

Miraculously these Ganeshas are all fractal, which means that they are forming out of dozens of small elephants.

Magic is unfolding, as soon as I do my printing work. My "models" gift me with different archetypes and stories, depending on their cultural environment. It seems as if the trees, stones or our environment in general record the history of their place and of its "clandestine" inhabitants.

I try to unveil the inner aspect, the very soul of nature, which has been well known and venerated in most ancient cultures.


